- Updates on antimicrobial resistance and animal welfare

What you will learn:

- Mast cell tumours – so common and so variable – how to establish a system of management for these horrible cancers that will work for you and your patients.
- Improved skills at diagnosing pneumonia and other respiratory conditions. The diagnosis of pneumonia hinges on the chest radiograph but knowing when to take chest radiographs can be tricky. The veterinarian must put together findings from the history, physical examination, and possibly response to initial therapies to decide if radiographs should be checked.
- Managing grief : How do you deal with giving and receiving bad news? What about your staff, your patients' families and how can this all be managed better? Share experiences if you like or just come along to switch gears and look at the human side of what we do.
- How to better help patients with cancer in the head, neck and thorax.
